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Abstract: *This electronic document is an IRS 2027 Paper Template for IEEE-Style Conference Proceedings. The various components of your paper, e.g. title, text, heads, etc., are already defined on the style sheet, as illustrated by the portions given in this document (Times New Roman, 11pt, Italic). This paper presents the IRS 2027 Word template for preparing conference manuscripts in an IEEE-style format. The template defines the required layout, section structure, citation style, and submission rules to ensure consistency across all contributions. Authors should follow the formatting instructions carefully and replace all placeholder text before submission.*

1. Introduction (Times New Roman, 14 pt, bold)

This template provides authors with the main formatting specifications needed to prepare electronic versions of their conference papers. It is intended to support a consistent appearance across all submissions and to simplify the final production process. Authors should use this template as a guide and ensure that all placeholder content is replaced with the final manuscript text. It has been tailored for output on DIN A4-sized paper (width 210 mm, length 297 mm) with the following margins:

Upper	- 25 mm
Lower	- 25 mm
Left & right	- 25 mm.

Please do NOT apply hyphenation, your own headers or footers.
(Times New Roman, 12pt, single line spacing, full justification)

2. Preparing Your Paper

Define abbreviations and acronyms the first time they are used in the text. Use consistent terminology throughout the paper and follow the prescribed style for equations, figures, tables, and references. Insert figures and tables after they are first cited in the text, and number them consecutively. Abbreviations such as IEEE, SI, MKS, CGS, sc, dc, and rms do not have to be defined. Do not use abbreviations in the title or heads unless they are unavoidable. You will need to determine whether or not your equation should be typed using either the Times New Roman or the Symbol font.

You have to number equations consecutively. Equation numbers, within parentheses, are to position flush right, as in (1), using a right tab stop. Equations should be entered inline $E = mc^2$ or in a separate line with equation numbering.

$$w(n) = 0.54 - 0.46 \cos\left(\frac{2\pi n}{N}\right). \quad (1)$$

Note that the equation is centered using a center tab stop. Be sure that the symbols in your equation have been defined before or immediately following the equation. Use “(1)”, not “Eq. (1)” or “equation (1)”, except at the beginning of a sentence: “Equation (1) is . . .”

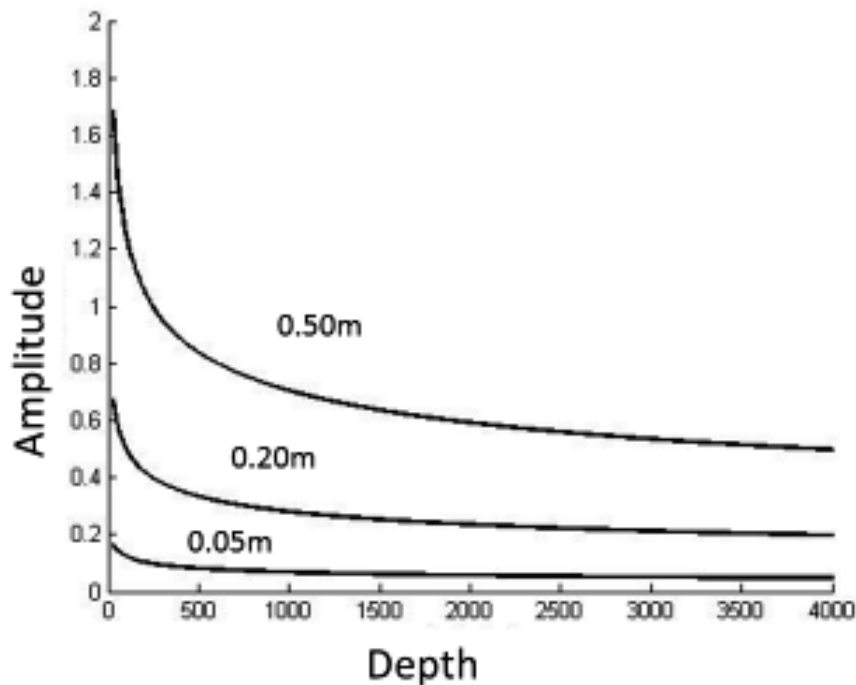


Figure 1. Very important result. (Times New Roman, 10 pt, centered)

The colorful version of figures will be implemented in the USB with the conference proceedings. Figure captions should be below the figures; table heads should appear above the tables. Insert figures and tables after they are cited in the text. Use the abbreviation “Fig. 1”, even at the beginning of a sentence. Use words rather than symbols or abbreviations when writing Figure axis labels to avoid confusing the reader.

You have to number citations consecutively within brackets [1]. Do not use “Ref. [1]” or “reference [1]” except at the beginning of a sentence: “Reference [1] was the first . . .”

3. Important Remarks

The electronic version have to be submitted online in Acrobat PDF format to the conference organizers via the IRS 2027 website before the specified deadlines.

Maximum number of pages is limited to 6.

At least one of the authors of each paper must accomplish the registration and pay a conference fee to guarantee the paper to be published in the Symposium proceedings. Each paper requires a separate registration.

All final papers must be converted to PDF Format by the IEEE eXpress service.

References should be listed in the order in which they appear in the text and formatted according to IEEE citation style. Each reference must be numbered consecutively using square brackets.
